

## GAA Injury Scheme 2010

1. As in previous years injured players must pay their own medical expenses and then claim them back from the club.
2. Please contact your health insurer (i.e. VHI, Aviva, Quinn etc. ) and find out if you are entitled to partial refund of your expenses.
3. If any benefit is due to you, you must send a receipt to your health insurer to claim this amount. ( A medical insurance form completed by you should accompany the receipts. This form can be downloaded from the club's website.) The balance will be refunded to you once you have been paid by your insurer.
4. If no benefit is due to you, you **MUST** get a letter from your insurer stating that no benefit is available to you under your health plan. The club can only refund you on production of this letter.
5. To obtain a refund you must fully complete a GAA Injury claim form and forward all receipts associated with your injury i.e. X-ray, G.P., A&E etc. as soon as possible to the club insurance officer. (Physiotherapy claims are not included in this scheme and are being dealt with by the club-see separate notice ). All claims are subject to a strict time limit of 60 days for completion.
